Building leaders and istructional coaches coordinate building—level parent involvement portunities. District and building administrators work together to prepare tices that need to go out district—wide and building—wide. The district rategic planning committee engages parents as well as local business leaders, do community members and organizations to ensure feedback and coordination from the community. The district Federal Program Coordinator also meets with hidling administrators to review guidance on family engagement and provide any upport, as well as meets with the Director of Student Services to include upports for transportation for homeless families, interpreters for ELL milies, and other support needed.

A team of people made up of administrators, parents, and teachers annually review the program guidelines before planning, conduct program evaluation, and review the developed plan to ensure that guidelines are followed and the content responds to district needs. The meetings include guidelines and requirements, district plans, parent engagement plans, student achievement data, student—parent compact, and parent survey feedback. An annual program evaluation is given to the board each school year. An annual survey is sent out to parents in the spring and the reviewed for additional feedback and changes needed.

Needs are consolidated from various sources: parent surveys, parent meetings, home visits, and responses to teachers. Parents are also able to alert staff to their needs during conferences in the fall and via phone calls or emails.

Describe method(s) for identifying strategies

MRH uses our program evaluation process to identify best practices in parent and family involvement. The district's preferred strategy includes a home visiting component where individual family needs can be discussed. We have also had success with providing parents with materials, resources, and training for helping their child with homework during the school year, providing parent resource libraries, and hosting curriculum nights. We have also been successful in providing technology access and communicating with families via technology platforms.
