Consultants will be hired to work with teachers on standards-based curriculum alignment as well as providing targeted professional development for teachers based on content area and teaching assignment and collaboration around data teams. The curriculum will be audited to ensure aligned assessment and anchor lessons. In classroom support, will be provided by building instructional coaches. Interventions will be identified and implemented to address the needs of individuals, small groups, or class groups not meeting the Missouri State Learning Standards and the deceleration of learning and creation of learning gaps.
